Jack M. Davis, 61, is senior vice president and chief nuclear officer at Detroit Edison, an electric utility serving 2.2 million customers in Southeastern Michigan. Detroit Edison is one of three major business units of DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a Detroit-based diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide. Davis is responsible for Detroit Edison's nuclear power generation, which includes the Fermi 2 Nuclear Power Plant, a 1,100-megawatt boiling water reactor located in Newport, Mich. The facility employs about 900 workers and produces approximately 15 percent of the power generated by Detroit Edison.

Prior to joining Detroit Edison, Davis served as site vice president at Dominion Energy's North Anna Power Station where he led the Station to high levels of safety and performance. The plant was consistently recognized as one of the country's best nuclear facilities. Davis joined Dominion Energy in 1997 and held several leadership roles in the company's nuclear operations area before being named vice president. Prior to his tenure at Dominion, Davis served as an officer in the United States Navy. He served as commanding officer of the fast attack submarine, USS Baton Rouge and the submarine tender USS L.Y. Spear. During his distinguished naval career, Davis served in a wide variety of positions on submarines and in supporting roles, including a Pentagon assignment on the Staff of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and as the Commanding Officer of the Nuclear Power Training Unit in Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Davis earned a bachelor of science degree in physics from the University of California, Los Angeles. He serves on the University of Michigan's Nuclear Engineering Advisory Council.
