Nick A. Khouri is vice president and treasurer of DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a Detroit-based diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide. DTE Energy's major subsidiaries include Detroit Edison, the nation's tenth largest electric utility and MichCon, the fifth largest natural gas utility. As Vice President and Treasurer, he is responsible for all banking and investment banking relationships, cash management, corporate finance, enterprise risk management, pension investments, and corporate Planning and Development.

Prior to joining DTE Energy, Khouri served as vice president of Public Sector Consultants, Inc., concentrating in the areas of economic development/public infrastructure and state and local tax policy. Khouri also served as the Chief Deputy Treasurer for the State of Michigan during the 1990's. The Department of Treasury is essentially the CFO for the State of Michigan, a \$50 billion a year enterprise. As Chief Deputy Treasurer, Khouri oversaw all department activities, including; debt financing, rating agency relations, the in-house management of a \$35 billion pension fund, state and local tax policy, and the collection of nearly \$40 billion of annual state revenues

Prior to joining the state treasury, Khouri was the Chief Economist for the Senate Fiscal Agency, a nonpartisan research agency of the Michigan Senate. He also served as an analyst in the macro-economic division of the U.S. Congressional Budget Office in Washington, D.C., and as an economist with the Bureau of Economic Analysis, U.S. Department of Commerce in Washington, D.C.

Khouri is a past chairman of the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority and a former member of the Michigan State Housing Development Authority and the Michigan Hospital Finance Authority.

Khouri currently serves as Chairman of EEI's Treasurer's Task Force, Chair of the Finance Committee for the Children's Hospital of Michigan, and Director of the Citizens Research Council. He is also Vice Chairman of Detroit's Local Initiatives Support Group, a non-profit organization committed to building affordable housing in Detroit.

Khouri earned a Bachelor of Arts in economics from the University of Michigan and a master's degree in economics from Michigan State University.
